## Senior Class DVD

## MAP Testing

During the weeks of January 9 and January 16, all freshmen and sophomore students will take tests called Measures of Academic Progress (MAP). We give MAP tests to determine a student's instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the year and from year to year in the areas of mathematics and reading. The students will take the tests on a computer.

MAP tests are unique in that they adapt to be appropriate for your child's level of learning. As a result, each student has the same opportunity to succeed and maintain a positive attitude toward testing. With

To assist you in helping your students do their very best in editing their work, here are a few tips from Adam Robinson's book *What Smart Students Know: Maximum Goals, Optimum Earning, Maximum Time*.

**Cut the fat:** Have your teen make a point of using fewer words.

**Read it aloud:** Listen for areas that are awkward and need rearranging.

**Check for overused words:** Did your teen use "really" in five of six paragraphs? Constantly using the same words makes writing boring.

**Check the logic:** Does the paper make sense? Does it move smoothly from one idea to the next? Is the meaning of the sentence and paragraph clear?

**Give credit where it's due:** It's fine to use someone else's words or ideas in a paper but not to pass those off as your own. Make sure sources are given proper credit.

**Proofread:** After all other editing is complete, read the paper carefully one more time. Check for misspelled words. (Spell check won't catch everything.)

We all look forward to a positive 2006 school year. I hope your students have a successful semester, and I do appreciate all your support in keeping our students on task to the end of the year.

## Air Soft Guns

For the past year in Johnson County, police have responded to calls involving a type of plastic pellet BB gun. These guns are made to look exactly like real handguns but have an orange tip on the barrel. The more expensive air pistols of this type are made of metal and have the same weight, look, and feel as the duty pistol the police carry. The air guns fire a rubber BB that travels 150 to 500 feet per second. Many young owners of these guns have either taken the orange tip off or painted the barrel black making the gun indistinguishable from any real pistol. The following have been problem areas for local police:

- Police are called when neighbors see what looks like a real gun being pointed and fired at teens in the backyard next door.
- Gun owners have pulled up and shot unsuspecting pedestrians, thinking it was funny. It is a felony to place someone in fear of injury or great bodily harm with a weapon, whether it is real or perceived.

The fact that this is a gun that shoots rubber pellets will not keep the teen from being arrested when they shoot

at or point this gun at someone.

- These guns look real. If one is pointed at the police, even in jest, it will be most likely be treated as a real threat and a tragedy might occur.

If your student is an owner of one of these guns, you are strongly urged to carefully monitor its use. If you have questions, please contact your school resource officer or a school administrator. Overland Park Police Department personnel will also provide information about these guns (913.895.6338).

Every year the counseling department works with the SME staff and administration to improve the enrollment process. Teacher recommendations for honors class placement is a very important part of this process.

### Course Recommendations for 2006 - 2007

The SME enrollment card is designed to leave space on the front for each Science, Social Studies, and English teacher to recommend a student for honors placement next year. They will complete this task by designating their recommendation with their initials on the front of the enrollment card. Math teachers will indicate their recommendations for math placement in the same manner; except that they will recommend for all math selections (honors and regular).

It will be each student's responsibility to acquire an honors recommendation from his or her core teacher, and a math recommendation from the appropriate teacher. It is imperative that each student acquires the recommendations s/he needs before the counselors return to English classes to finalize enrollment.

### Self-Selecting an Honors Class Without a Recommendation

A FORM IS REQUIRED TO TAKE AN HONORS CLASS WITHOUT A RECOMMENDATION. Each student and his/her parent must sign a form for self-selecting an honors class without a recommendation. This form must be turned in with the enrollment card when enrollment is finalized. These Self-selecting forms are available in the counseling office.

Note: This process replaces the appeal process that was in place during past years.

### What Parents Can Do To Assist with Enrollment

Parents play a very important role in this process. Please encourage your student to take advantage of the variety of courses offered at SM East. It is important to consider enrolling for the prerequisites for future courses. We request that all parents sign their student's enrollment card. Please help your student to select his/her courses carefully. This will help avoid schedule change requests in the future. For a variety of reasons it is sometimes impossible to change a schedule once the courses have been selected. This is a cooperative effort. With your support we can help your student enroll in the courses he/she wants.

## Please Stay in Your Seats

We ask that all spectators remain in the bleachers after our basketball games. We appreciate the enthusiasm and support of our student body at games, and we sincerely believe we have the best student support in the area; however, the potential exists for people to get severely hurt in the frenzy.

Two years ago, a basketball player in Tucson, Arizona, was seriously injured when he was trampled on the court by a large group of celebrating fans following a victory. Joe Kay, who had already been awarded a volleyball scholarship to Stanford University, suffered a stroke during the celebration. Kay was swarmed when about 200 fans rushed the court after his team won a highly contested game. Kay somehow fell into the large crowd and was trampled by the swarming fans. The stroke occurred when Kay somehow suffered a torn carotid artery in his neck.

Even though the situation in Arizona is very rare, we don't want to do anything to put any of our players or fans at risk. Additionally, we don't want to do anything to provoke the students from the opposing school. We ask that all students and fans remain in the bleachers until the teams have shaken hands and leave the gym. Your support is much appreciated.
